## From the Pastor...the coming of Christmas

The church season of Advent revolves around waiting...waiting for the Christ child to come, waiting for hope, peace, joy, and love to enter into our lives fully. This year, our world seems in particular need of the gifts Christ brings. The past months have brought countless disasters from hurricanes and forest fires at home to tsunamis and earthquakes abroad. The earth cries out to us through these natural disasters, begging to be made whole again. The past months have also brought unimagined tragedy as gunmen have shot down larger numbers of people than perhaps we thought possible and in places that are sacred and meant to feel secure. Our thoughts and prayers continue to surround those who lost loved ones in Las Vegas and Sutherland Springs and all those who suffer the effects of meaningless violence. These past months have also brought with them an awareness of the perils of war. We continue to find no end to the conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan, and we worry about a potential war with North Korea. And then there are the deficits of hope, peace, joy, and love in our own personal lives. What great disappointments have you faced this year? Are you finding a way forward? What does the coming of the Christ child mean for you?

Advent, it seems to me, reflects the realities of our life here together more than any other season of the church year. We are waiting: waiting for hope to fill our hearts, waiting for peace to descend on earth, waiting for joy to infuse our lives, waiting for love to rule the day. Sometimes the waiting can feel heavy, and that's why the season of Advent is so important. It reminds us that we are not alone even when we feel discouraged or angry or frustrated or hurt. The church is with us. Our community of faith is with us. God is with us. And as hard as it can be to wait patiently for Christ to come and resolve all of this messiness, there is something we can do. WE can bring hope. WE can send peace. WE can share joy. WE can wrap others in God's love.

Each Sunday during this season of Advent, we will focus on one of these themes. On November 26, we brought hope as we lit candles of hopefulness in worship. December 3, there will be tables with cards set up in the CrossWay for you to sign which will be sent to the

## From the Council President...

It has been a busy fall with lots of exciting things happening around the church, especially our celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. It is hard for me to comprehend that one man started the Reformation that is the foundation of most all Protestant churches of today. While we certainly have a long history at Christ Lutheran, which Pastor Steve Rode reminded us about on our anniversary Sunday, comparatively, we are in our infancy. The question for all of us any time we look at our past is also: what will our future be?

Who we are today and who we want to be in our future are questions we must continually ask ourselves, and it is something we talk about frequently during Congregation Council meetings. To help us define ourselves and what we see as our mission to our congregation and to our greater community, we have done things like the recent questionnaires and our "house meetings" to help us make sure we are serving the needs and interests of our congregation. As always, we welcome any other types of input or information about new or different ways we can be stewards to our community.

We have been blessed with a generous gift from the John & Ingrid Murray Estate, which was directed to making improvements to our Sipe organ. While some (probably most) of you are more musically inclined than I am, you still may not be aware of the issues our organ has been experiencing due to its age and normal wear and tear. After an extensive search for an organ builder who could offer us the most and best improvements for our money and who is available to do the work, we signed a contract in an effort to update our organ to function properly. Repairs are scheduled to begin sometime after Easter. During the repair process, there will be a few weeks when our organ is inoperable for worship services. The plan is to have all the work done and the organ work completed by January, 2019. We are very grateful for this generous gift and give thanks that it will ensure that our organ will make beautiful music for years to come.

We as a church are blessed by our members who donate both their time and financial support which allows us to do things like this organ update. As another calendar year comes to a close, here is one final reminder of what makes us a unique church is our continued practice of dedicating 20 percent of all of our offering to various benevolence recipients: a double tithe. While obviously secularly focused, remember that your donations to our offerings are good for your tax deductions as well and allow us to provide additional help at a time that many organizations are stretched to their limits.

I hope that everyone has a blessed Christmas and has the chance to reflect upon the past year and the many gifts all of us have received.
