From the Stewardship Team: I LoveThis Church...

Our church is a place where we come together for community and connection, nourishment, and respite. As we plan for Stewardship Sunday (April 28) and as you prayerfully consider your pledge, take a moment to think about what you love most about our Christ Lutheran community and the resources it needs to ensure those efforts continue to be successful – from Sunday services to children's programming to music to benevolence.

During this month of focus on stewardship, we'll have several resources available so you can express your love for our church and embrace a vision for a strong future at Christ Lutheran.

- **Reflect:** April Sunday services will include a Temple Talk series. Church members will share what makes Christ Lutheran membership and giving meaningful to them. We invite you to use those conversations as an opportunity for reflection on your own experiences.
- Learn: On Sunday, April 21, we'll host a meeting during Adult Education, where we'll dive into a full report on our church. We'll cover what we love about our community, review where we've been and our past successes, and discuss the vision we have for deepening our connections and service in the future.
- Share: We want to hear what matters to you and why you continue to make Christ Lutheran your chosen church home. Look for our bulletin board in the CrossWay, where you can post the reasons you love our community along with opportunities to share your "I Love This Church" moment on our social media accounts.
- **Commit:** In mid-April, you'll receive a mailing containing a letter and pledge card, inviting you to consider your commitment to Christ Lutheran in terms of time, talent, and treasure and asking you to return your pledge card during worship on Sunday, April 28.

Focusing on our community brings this verse to mind: "Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it." (1 Cor. 12:27). When we say, "I Love This Church," it's more than the building or the programs we offer. It's a message of love for each of the people who give, share, and support our Christ Lutheran community.

April 7 & 14 – Join us as Chaplain Rev. Darwin Huartson teaches a two-part class on grief.

• April 7 – "Navigating Choppy Waters"

Dr. Alan Wolfelt, a grief therapist and author writes, "To mourn your loss is required if you befriend the love you have been granted. To honor your grief is not destructive or harmful, it is life sustaining." Grief is normal, natural, and a necessary response to loss. It is a time of adjustment and healing. We can experience healing and wholeness when we allow ourselves to process our losses and make our grief count. Our experiences with Covid certainly remind us that our losses are finite and non-finite. Many of us learned that we are resilient people who can adapt and adjust to life's circumstances. Come and join Chaplain Darwin to discuss how not only to survive grief but how to adapt and evolve new blessings from it as well.

• April 14 – "Connecting with Those Facing a Difficult Time"

When we hear about someone who is grieving or experiencing emotional pain, it is not uncommon for us to wonder, "What should I say or do?" Many times, our first desire is to try and "fix" the situation. Rarely can a response by itself make something better, but empathy helps us connect and assures others that they are cared for. Join Chaplain Darwin to explore how our own awareness of our loss and grief can inform us on how we respond to others. Utilizing our own life experiences, we will make a list of "what has been helpful" and "what is not so helpful" in responding to others.

April 21 – "I Love This Church"

Pastor Leslie and our Stewardship Team will delve into a full report on our church. We'll cover what we love about our community, review where we've been and our past successes, and discuss the vision we have for deepening our connections and service in the future.

April 28 – Christian Nationalism

Beginning Sunday, April 28, Pastor H will welcome interested participants to a discussion of the rising trend of Christian Nationalism. This alliance of strong political nationalism and certain Christian faith communities challenges traditional views of separation of church and state. Implications of this rising trend are significant in this increasingly polarized period of American and Western European history. All are welcome to this conversation on three Sundays: April 28, May 12 and 19 at 9:30 am in Fellowship Hall.

CLC Benevolence Partner Corner Christian Assistance Ministry (CAM)

I moved to San Antonio in 2014 mainly because my sister lived here. She helped me find a place to live and acquainted me with the area. She suggested that I join Christ Lutheran Church of Alamo Heights and that she and I should volunteer at CAM. She told me that in 1977, nine downtown churches (now about 80) founded Christian Assistance Ministry as a non-profit in response to the Biblical imperative "to feed the hungry, clothe the naked and care for the needy." We began our service at the main campus in a retired school building at Grace Lutheran Church downtown, on Tuesday mornings from 9:00 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. I was impressed with the efficient system CAM has established and how many ways they have found to help folks with critical needs. It was a privilege for me to serve as a volunteer for CAM. I saw how efficient this organization is for those in need. They have only 23 paid employees and over 200 loyal and hardworking volunteers. I am now one of several representatives at the CAM Council of Churches for Christ Lutheran and receive CAM's Annual Report supplying data for the benefit of the member churches. That is my source for the following CAM data for 2023:

*18,595 households received groceries one time per month (enough for 3-4 days)

*19,511 folks got clothing for each household member – up to two outfits each month

*10,000 were served through information and referral (phone calls seeking help/advice)

*6,736 were helped with utilities, ID recovery, prescriptions, bus tickets/bus passes (for work or medical appointments), or specialized help for the homeless – at a total cost of \$302,022

*2,234 typically homeless picked up their mail at CAM

*1,627 children were provided with Christmas gifts (2 brand new gifts, 2 books, stocking stuffers, and stuffed animals for ages 9-18 months)

*624 schoolchildren were provided with school supplies, backpacks, uniforms, underwear, socks, and a voucher for a pair of new shoes

In 2023 CAM provided specifically for the homeless:

*69,900 total sack lunches distributed six days each week

*3,833 showers plus new socks and underwear

*6,325 engagements with people experiencing homelessness and 800 housing or shelter placements and/or police assists

*280 homeless received special financial help to return home and/or were provided hotel stays, cell phones, shoes, medication, etc.

(Christian Assistance Ministry is one of more than 25 local, Lutheran, and international charitable organizations that shares 20% of Christ Lutheran's weekly worship offerings.
