"Hospitality of the Soul" -- Fresh thoughts from an old thinker

Saint Augustine lived from 354-430 of the Common Era. He was a Bishop in Africa (modern day Algeria) and probably the best known scholar/thinker of the Christian community of his time. Scholars of church history have identified him as "Doctor Pacis" or the Theologian of Peace for his passion for justice, which he believed leads to peace in the world.

Augustine wrote many books and remains widely read among theologians and philosophers even in 2023. He often preached about "hospitality of the soul" as a characteristic of faith, whereby one receives another person personally and honors them, as they are created in the divine image and stand as another person for whom Christ died. Every friendship, every human encounter becomes an opportunity to receive and respect another person, regardless of whether you agree with them.

"Come to the Lord's Table" is the theme of worship this season as we return to our full programmatic schedule. Every gathering in Word and Sacrament, every small group, every study occasion can reflect the invitation our Creator extends to us to be nurtured in community, whether formally in the sanctuary of Christ Lutheran Church or merely in the company of one another.

I recall the teachings of Saint Augustine under this seasonal theme, as it was in reading Augustine that I also came to appreciate his belief in the value of political systems and government as communal opportunities for hospitality and care, even of our souls. Augustine believed that we have political leaders to safeguard the "good ends of earthly life, which are peace and justice" (Augustine of Hippo as Politician, Catholic University Press, Louvain, 2019). He taught that in this earthly life, peace and justice are reflections of heavenly peace and justice, the very foundation of earthly order and stability.

With every act of hospitality – when we greet and welcome one another on Sunday morning, when we gather with friends for dinner or reading or study, or when we invite little ones to the altar for Children's Time on Sunday mornings with Ms. Carrie, we are building on the

All human relationships rooted in a foresight for peace and justice bring about, even in small ways, reflections of the heavenly peace and justice to come.

Perhaps you have thought of hospitality as just a kind handshake or embrace, and such kind gestures certainly are that. Augustine would have us look deeper into hospitality as an extension of God's receiving us, just as we are, thereby glimpsing what Matthew's Gospel calls the kingdom of heaven.

Come to the Lord's Table! With this hospitality, we can build a more peaceful and just world, together.

The traditions of All Saints and *Dia de los Muertos* are beloved at Christ Lutheran. They allow us to gather and remember, grieve, celebrate, and find solace and hope. During worship at 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. you will find our All Saints Altar at the front of the church, surrounding the font, reminding us of our baptismal promises that no matter what, even death, we are forever held in love by God. You are invited to bring pictures and mementos of loved ones to place on the altar throughout the morning. There you will also see candles strewn across the table that will be lighted during worship in remembrance of the saints who have gone before us. A special bell will toll in memory of all those members and friends of our community of faith that have died since our last All Saints remembrance, as we lift their names in prayer. In between worship services, during our education hour, we will continue our remembering by sharing stories of the saints and creating projects in their memory. Again, please bring pictures and mementos of your beloved to share and to place on our *Dia de los Muertos* Altar. We will close our time together with a brief service of remembrance.

For a little background on this colorful, meaningful celebration:

El Día de los Muertos is a unique cultural tradition that remembers those loved ones who have gone before us. It is an annual three-day Mexican festival where family and friends remember departed loved ones. It is a vibrant celebration of life that gives artistic expression to mourning through music, color, dance, food, art, flowers, and more. The dead are celebrated literally as though still alive and ofrendas or "offerings" are made in memory of them and their favorite sports, foods, drinks, and pastimes. Calaveras literarias are poems written for the dead, to celebrate their life and remember them. Mexico's Día de los Muertos inspires us to enrich our own tradition of remembering the saints who have gone before us.

CLC Benevolence Partners Corner Northeast Senior Assistance (NESA)

We support many non-profit organizations with 20% of our weekly offerings at Christ Lutheran Church in partnership with various benevolence causes. Recently we visited one of our benevolence partners, Northeast Senior Assistance, to see how they are benefiting the community.

Northeast Senior Assistance serves seniors ages 60+ primarily with transportation needs. They started serving the community in 1984. Their primary mission is to drive seniors to and from medical appointments, stay with them throughout, and then drive them home. Data provided from OneStar Foundation indicates that over 30,000 residents in northeast San Antonio are living below the poverty line. It is essential to provide seniors with transportation to stay healthy and connected to the community.

NESA drivers are very committed to this mission. Frequently they will include visits to the grocery store, minor home repairs and more. Drivers commit to anywhere from once a month to several times a week. Services through this organization are provided at no cost to the senior. NESA is a Christian organization, and their mission is centered in the love we have for one another. Christ Lutheran Church has been a supporter of NESA for many years with our funding and with volunteers.
