<u>Words from the Pastor</u> The Season of Pentecost and the Language of Faith

Speech and the acquisition of language skills have always fascinated me. From my childhood years when I heard my parents speaking their native language (Norwegian) to currently hearing my grandchildren speaking not only English but Spanish and Portuguese as well, I marvel at the sound and organization of human language. Little ones seem to acquire language skills more readily, and rapidly than folks my age.

The United Nations Regional Information Center last week made available a study by Dr. Leanor Smalle, a professor and researcher at Belgium's Ghent University, providing insight regarding the acquisition of language. Her discoveries teach us about life and faith as well.

Dr. Smalle learned that very young children acquire language skills quite spontaneously, through passive listening and imitation. Developmental linguists call this "implicit" or unconscious learning. It just seems to happen, and quickly! As adults, we employ "explicit" language development or more conscious learning. It happens in a different part of the brain! We develop our "explicit" or conscious learning through adolescence, a capability required for more complex problem-solving as adults. We lose much of that "implicit" learning capability as we age.

The Pentecost story and the weeks that follow Pentecost are all about language – the language of faith. I believe there are parallels involved between language acquisition and spiritual/faith formation. Many of us can recall learning about Jesus from Sunday School teachers and family members. We listened. We learned songs. We memorized such seeds of faith. These gifts came to us, and we received them implicitly by just "being there" with our parents and teachers.

It is my view that, like language acquisition, we mature in our faith lives toward a more "explicit" or conscious spirituality. Our major life decisions, such as choice of a life's partner, vocational discernment, and ethical patterns of behavior all become explicit, conscious choices, informed from deep roots of faith in something that is beyond ourselves; something creative and eternal. For the person mature in faith, our lives develop from roots of implicit

learning deep in our history, even our collective histories, to a shared way of life in community.

Our shared ministry at Christ Lutheran Church embraces opportunities for the spiritual development and maturation of every person in our community: caring for the newest members of the human race brought forth for baptism, to our most senior members. Little ones are constantly learning from the more mature, implicit in their spiritual formation at first, then maturing themselves, as they make consequential life decisions as they grow. The variety of speech, the varieties of culture, and even other religious traditions can enlighten us throughout life to the infinite working of the Holy Spirit in every person.

May our congregation continue to welcome and nurture every person who comes to us, every culture they represent, every language they speak, as they are all evidence that the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, the presence of the Risen Christ, is among us in each of them.

New Staff Position at CLC: Minister of Mission and Outreach

More than 20 years ago Christ Lutheran Church committed to serving our San Antonio community and beyond by sending 20% of all our offerings to non-profit benevolence ministries outside our walls. We have maintained that commitment through all the challenges of recent decades, including the worldwide pandemic. Lives have been changed with those dollars as unhoused persons and families, teen mothers, immigrants, refugees, and impoverished persons in need of hospice ministries have found shelter and care.

Two generous designated gifts will help us build on our 20% benevolence tradition, completely funding the first year of a new part-time Minister for Mission and Outreach. Elward Reiss offered a gift in memory of her beloved husband Bernie Reiss, and another generous donor, who prefers to remain anonymous, covered the remainder. Their generosity provides initial support toward realizing our dream of having a staff person dedicated to connecting us more fully to those in need outside our congregation.

CLC's clergy and Congregation Council stand exuberantly and unanimously behind the creation of this new position, fully committed to funding the Minister of Mission and Outreach for the long term. Though the budgetary impact may be modest, the harvest will far outweigh the dollars spent. This ministry will connect us to recipients/benevolence partners in concrete, measurable ways, enhancing reporting and accountability in serving those most vulnerable.

As we continue our 20+ year tradition of care for those in greatest need, your pastors and Congregation Council invite all church members to attend our Annual Meeting on Sunday, June 30 following worship, where we will discuss this new position and its impact on our life together.

Confirmands: Class of 2024

On Sunday, May 19, CLC welcomed three bright, fine young confirmands into our loving fold. The three – Madisyn Castaneda, Maximilian von Durckheim, and Silas Tenorio, wrote and presented their faith statements during worship. Each was thoughtful, spiritual, and candid. We share with you excerpts from each of their statements:

Madisyn Castaneda: Some of the people who have helped me understand and come to terms with my religion can't be with us today ... but I thank Mr. Troy (Hall) and his Sunday school classes in the mornings. Though I do sometimes turn it into more of a debate class, it always creates a safe space for me to express my opinions on religion without getting judged ... Some people in this congregation that have helped and influenced me along the way are Ms. Alfreda (Pennington), Mr. Frankie (Pennington), Ms. Wanda (Landwehr), Mr. Jerry (Landwehr), Ms. Verna (Fletcher), and Ms. Vaughnell (Gray) ... Most of all, thank you to my family and to Mama Sue and Pop for pushing me and encouraging me.

Maximilian von Durckheim: We had been searching for the right church for a while, but I didn't know that finding Christ Lutheran and finding Jesus would completely change my family and myself. I have only been at this church since September. The first time I attended a service, I was blown away by Pastor Leslie's sermon and how welcoming the community was. All the ushers greeted my family like we had been there many times. As we walked to my first Confirmation Conversation, everybody came up and introduced themselves. After class, I knew this was where I belonged ... I also noticed that my family and I were happier after services. I felt more spiritually connected to Jesus and prayers became more meaningful. It felt like I had found a missing piece that I had been searching for my whole life. This community felt like a second home.

Silas Tenorio: I have been going to church as long as I can remember, and I do believe in God. I tend to pray when I would like to talk to God for a minute or two. A person who has influenced me is my grandma. When she leaves our house or hangs up the phone, she says God bless. When we have little debates while we do the dishes, we tend to get into the topic of God. Some time ago, she was given a set time to live. It broke my heart ... My Grandma is the sweetest lady ever, and I have been praying that when I hear about her next, it's because she's getting better. God continues to answer my prayers.

Ministry Reports Elect Congregation Council Members Adopt the Budget
