From the Senior Pastor...longing for peace...

When I hear the word "peace" these days, my heart lurches, and my throat closes; tears even start to form in my eyes. Like so many of you, I find myself yearning for peace in Gaza, peace in Israel, peace in Iran, peace in Ukraine, peace in Russia, peace in the United States. From politics at home to politics abroad, everyone seems to be at war. Images of innocent people affected by the fighting horrify us, and we know that this isn't what God wants for our life together.

In the harried days of being a mom to twin five-year-olds and senior pastor to a congregation, I feel my life moving fast, the days flying by, the to-do lists never complete, and I wonder what, if anything, I can do to work toward peace. I comfort myself with the reminder that every loving act is a step toward peace, but I also feel it isn't enough.

I know that I am not the only one carrying a heavy heart. I know that I am not the only one looking for ways to help. I know there is more I could be doing, that we could be doing. As your pastor, I want to model sitting with that truth and not shying away from it. I see it as the first important step to discerning what God might be calling us to, as individuals and as a congregation. I invite you in the days and weeks ahead to contemplate this with me and to get creative. What are bold ways we might call for peace and work toward peace as the community of faith, Christ Lutheran Church? Email me, call me, or pull me aside on a Sunday morning and share your discoveries and your ideas with me. "Jesus began to speak and taught them saying: 'Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.'" (Matthew 5:9)

Synod Assembly, May 3-5

Synod Assembly will be held May 3-5 this year in Corpus Christi. The theme of the Assembly is *Called and Sent*, speaking to our discipleship as followers of Jesus. The assembly offering this year will be for Lutheran Disaster Response. This ministry plays a key role in our being sent into the world and responding to all kinds of needs. In addition to monetary offerings, assembly participants will be making various kinds of disaster preparedness and response kits. Voting members, both clergy and lay, will gather from across our synod to represent their congregations in making decisions about the issues facing the larger church, including electing a bishop to serve our synod. We are very grateful to James Ehler, Paul Pfeifer, and Carrie Jowers for agreeing to serve as our lay voting members. Thanks to Parker Jowers, who will serve as our youth lay voting member. Pastor Leslie, Pastor H and Rev. David Schulte (member at CLC) will be there as well. Many thanks to Rev. Tom Robison who will be preaching and teaching while our pastors are at Assembly. <u>CLC Benevolence Partners Corner</u> Northeast Senior Assistance (NESA)

Our CLC Benevolence gifts are not of the magnitude of influential funding entities such as the Kronkosky Charitable Foundation, San Antonio Area Foundation, or Methodist Healthcare Ministries. But they are impactful and important to our benevolence partners. Several members of CLC serve on the St. Luke's Lutheran Health Ministries (SLLHM) Board of Directors. One of the questions we ask of grant applicants is, "Who are your top contributors for the past three years?" Recently, Northeast Senior Assistance (NESA) requested a grant from SLLHM, and I was delighted to see that Christ Lutheran of Alamo Heights was listed as one of its top contributors when they cited our \$5,000 annual gift.

NESA's volunteer-run program, which was featured in the October 2023 Proclaimer, allows seniors to remain in their own homes for as long as safely possible by providing free transportation to medical providers and grocery stores. Many of NESA's senior clients have outlived their spouse or friends, are alone and have become isolated in their own homes, which can be detrimental to their health. NESA volunteers provide critical transportation along with priceless companionship.

To access NESA services, seniors must be age 60+, live within the NESA service area, and no longer drive or no longer drive on the highway. NESA sends an Outreach Nurse to assess applicants' health/mobility/fall risk. They currently have 392 senior clients and are always looking for volunteer drivers to support demand and expand services. They are located at 2903 Nacogdoches Road on the MacArthur Park Lutheran Church campus. If you would like to befriend a lonely senior and be a hero, visit neseniorassistance.org, or call 210-967-6372. Volunteers are reimbursed for gas mileage.
