That we may listen and learn from those around us. Amen.





INSTALLATION OF DEACON LISA DIANA AS MINISTER OF WORD AND SERVICE (10:30 a.m.)

PRESENTATION

The assembly stands as able.

Having been authorized by the church to install Deacon Lisa Diana, our co-worker in the gospel, as Minister of Mission & Outreach, I now ask for certification of this call.

A representative of the calling body addresses the presiding minister.

After prayerful deliberation, we, of Christ Lutheran Church have called Deacon Lisa Diana to serve as a minister of word and service in the position of Minister of Mission & Outreach. I present Deacon Lisa and this letter certifying the call.

The representative gives the presiding minister the letter certifying that the call has been received and accepted. The representative moves aside, and the assembly is seated.

ADDRESS AND QUESTIONS

The presiding minister addresses the minister of word and service.

Our Lord, who came among us as a servant, calls us to faith and a life of loving service to our neighbor. You come among us as one called and set apart for the ministry of word and service, a gift from God to inspire us to love and service to Christ.

A reading from Mark: Jesus said, "You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many." (Mark 10:42-43, 45)

A reading from Romans: As in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness. (Romans 12:4-8)

A reading from First Peter: Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received. Whoever speaks must do so as one speaking the very words of God; whoever serves must do so with the strength that God supplies, so that God may be glorified in all things through Jesus Christ. (1 Peter 4:10-11)

The presiding minister addresses questions to the minister of word and service.

Deacon Lisa, in the presence of this assembly will you commit yourself to this new trust and responsibility, in the confidence that it comes from God through the call of the church? *Response:* I will, and I ask God to help me.

Will you carry out this ministry in accordance with the holy scriptures and with the confessions of the Lutheran church and in harmony with the constitutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America? *Response:* I will, and I ask God to help me.

Will you be diligent in your study of the holy scriptures and faithful in your use of the means of grace?

Response: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Trusting in God's care, will you witness to Jesus Christ in word and deed, pray for God's people, seek to grow in love for those you serve, strive for excellence in your skills, and adorn the gospel of Jesus Christ with a godly life? *Response:* I will, and I ask God to help me.

Will you give faithful witness in the world, that God's love may be known in all that you do? *Response:* I will, and I ask God to help me.

Almighty God, who has given you the will to do these things, graciously give you the strength and compassion to perform them.

The assembly responds: Amen.

The assembly stands as able.

The presiding minister addresses the assembly.

People of God, will you receive Deacon Lisa into this ministry as one called and sent to serve all people in Christ's name?

We will, and we ask God to help us.

Will you pray for Deacon Lisa? Will you help and honor her in carrying out this ministry? In all things, will you strive to live together in the peace and unity of Christ? We will, and we ask God to help us.

The presiding minister addresses the minister of word and service.

Deacon Lisa Diana, the ministry of Minister of Mission and Outreach is now committed to you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

PRAYER

Let us pray. Merciful God, as your beloved Son cared for those who were troubled, brought healing and wellness the sick, and bound up the broken-hearted, so you have called Deacon Lisa to offer aid to the suffering and forgotten in our world. Make your servant wise in using knowledge and skill, diligent in ministering to those in need, and compassionate in all service. In the midst of her ministry, make Deacon Lisa a faithful witness to the hope of the resurrection; through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**

BLESSING

The newly installed deacon may kneel as the presiding minister proclaims God's blessing. 

DISTRIBUTION

Two thousand years ago Jesus ate with sinners and those whom others scorned. He still does. None of us is worthy, except by God's grace. No matter what you have done or what your present condition, Christ our Lord invites to his table all who love him, who earnestly repent of their sin, and who seek to live in peace with one another.

The gathered faithful have a choice to commune at the front of the sanctuary by intinction or in their seats with individual communion packets available at the entrance to the sanctuary. With intinction, the bread is placed in your hand for you to dip in the wine. Anyone who is unable to come forward may indicate to an usher that you wish to receive communion from a minister where you are seated. Gluten-free wafers are found on the small table next to the usher stand for anyone who needs them.

CONGREGATIONAL FORUM

Sunday, November 10, 9:30 a.m., Fellowship Hall

The Congregation Council, Property Team, and a newly formed Capital Advance Team invite you to gather for a congregation-wide conversation about our aging Education Wing and Fellowship Hall. A quick tour of these spaces (including the upstairs of the Education Wing) reveals the obvious – that these buildings are no longer simply dated but in need of significant repair . . . lighting, HVAC, electrical, windows, cosmetic, and other structural and modernization upgrades.

Both spaces have sustained significant water damage during severe rains, and the Fellowship Hall additionally suffers from a deteriorating foundation. While we have made repairs as needed, the buildings reflect their age. Years of vibrant ministry, education, celebrations, and memories in these spaces have taken their toll. The Council, Property Team, and Campaign Advance Team, as dedicated and faithful leaders of our church, have considered several potential pathways to address these facility issues. Before making any firm decisions on which pathway to take moving forward, they would very much like an opportunity to hear from each of you.

These leaders recognize that we are a strong and thriving congregation, approaching 100 years in ministry together! Their vision is to prepare us for another 100 years of ministry in this place. They know that each member and visitor at Christ Lutheran has a unique voice and perspective to share, and they invite each of you to contribute to our vision for Christ Lutheran's future.

Please join us on November 10, when we will present a brief overview of some of our options to address these property concerns. At this meeting, we will be grateful to hear your thoughts so that we may make wise, prudent decisions as we move forward, working together as a church family.
