We are grateful to Lori for her years of full-time service as our Office Administrator, and we are even more grateful that she will stay on staff ably performing her remaining duties from home on a schedule more conducive to caring for and supporting her aging parents.

Additionally, Carrie Jowers, our long-time Director of Faith Formation, shared with me her decision to retire from ministry at the end of July. For a decade, Carrie has diligently and passionately shepherded our children and youth in growing their faith and their relationships with God, mentors, and peers. I know she will be greatly missed in her role, and we will have a chance to celebrate her and thank her at a retirement event for her this summer. We are so happy that Carrie, Jeff, Sophia, and Parker will remain members of Christ Lutheran Church, but as Carrie retires at the end of July, we ask the congregation to maintain good boundaries and allow her to become a regular member, worshiping among us like any other. Soon we will form a search committee for a new Director of Faith Formation that will include a cross-section of parents of children of all ages to provide input and wisdom as we select a new person to fill this roll. 

February 2, 9 – Briefly, Perfectly Human Book Discussion

Briefly Perfectly Human is a memoir by Alua Arthur, a leading death doula in the United States, that explores how embracing death can lead to a more fulfilling life. Arthur's memoir weaves together her own life experiences with the stories of people she has helped as a death doula. She argues that thinking about death can help people find new potential in their lives and live more authentically. Reviewers have called the book "a poetic, inspiring book," "a beautiful, raw, light-bringing experience," and "a deeply urgent, divinely-inspired memoir." Pastor Leslie will lead us in conversation: part teaching, part discussion, part exploration over this four-week study as we learn how to embrace death so that we may fully live.

February 16, 23 – Spiritual Partners

Dr. Timothy A. Thorstenson, an ELCA pastor and clinical pastoral educator for 40 years, has written a book entitled Beyond Belief, sharing from his experience as a pastoral care provider and teacher. His life's work centers in care for persons through their life transitions, often involving life-changing illness. His wisdom and gentle guidance inspire readers to appreciate and respect the person in their transition and their spirituality, rather than imposing one's own.

This model provides a great approach to living in any community of faith, particularly if one engages in visitation ministries with those who may be ill or aging. Pastor H and Deacon Lisa Diana, along with others who have participated in visitation ministries here at CLC, invite all congregants to a discussion of Dr. Thorstenson's work and how it applies to our life together. We will gather on 16 and 23 February during our Faith University hour (9:30-10:15). Copies of Beyond Belief will be available in February and participants are invited to read this fascinating book prior to gathering on the 16th. All are invited!




