


Lift up your hearts.

Do this for the remembrance of me.


LORD'S PRAYER

DISTRIBUTION

Two thousand years ago Jesus ate with sinners and those whom others scorned. He still does. None of us is worthy, except by God's grace. No matter what you have done or what your present condition, Christ our Lord invites to his table all who love him, who earnestly repent of their sin, and who seek to live in peace with one another.

The gathered faithful have a choice to commune at the front of the sanctuary by intinction or in their seats with individual communion packets available at the entrance to the sanctuary. With intinction, the bread is placed in your hand for you to dip in the wine. Anyone who is unable to come forward may indicate to an usher that you wish to receive communion from a minister where you are seated. Gluten-free wafers are found on the small table next to the usher stand for anyone who needs them.

Week Four of Lent Your Hearts of Mercy Can Bring Hope to a Refugee Family

Despite the enormous obstacles placed in their path by the loss of government funds to help refugees, Global Refuge continues to serve the refugees who so desperately seek help in resettling after fleeing the violence and crime in their home countries.

Whom do they serve? Afghan allies who risked their lives to aid U.S. troops, Ukrainians, Syrians, Somalians, Burmese, Congolese, and refugees from South and Central America – in short, folks fleeing countries where there is turmoil and their lives and livelihoods are endangered.

The cash assistance the refugees have been promised is no longer available after the government cut funding to Global Refuge. Andrew Steele, Global Refuge Chief Development and Mobilization Officer, says, "Legally, refugees are bound to take the first job they are offered, and language barriers can severely limit those offers. That's why you see physicians and teachers working as janitors and dishwashers." He notes, "Most of the refugees are so determined to survive and thrive and have undergone so much trauma that they work very hard to integrate and succeed."

The staff at Global Refuge is passionately dedicated to helping the refugees under their care. Although their Programs Outreach & Volunteer Coordinator was among the staff that lost jobs after DOGE cut off their funding, she sent out a final plea for help before she left her post. Here are some of the urgent client needs she mentioned in her note:

Global Refuge is in crisis. It requires Hearts of Mercy. Our congregation has a long history of sharing its merciful hearts with those in need, as Jesus would have us do. These words from Matthew 25:35-40 are our guidepost in Lent, and in everyday life. "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me."
