
Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying:

DISTRIBUTION

Two thousand years ago Jesus ate with sinners and those whom others scorned. He still does. None of us is worthy, except by God's grace. No matter what you have done or what your present condition, Christ our Lord invites to his table all who love him, who earnestly repent of their sin, and who seek to live in peace with one another.

The gathered faithful have a choice to commune at the front of the sanctuary by intinction or in their seats with individual communion packets available at the entrance to the sanctuary. With intinction, the bread is placed in your hand for you to dip in the wine. Anyone who is unable to come forward may indicate to an usher that you wish to receive communion from a minister where you are seated. Gluten-free wafers are found on the small table next to the usher stand for anyone who needs them.

Week Two of Lent Global Refuge: Pray, Volunteer, Advocate, Give

We look into our Hearts of Mercy this week as we dedicate our Lenten worship offerings to Global Refuge. This 85-year-old non-profit (formerly known as Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services) is reeling from the unexpected stoppage of federal dollars needed to help resettle hundreds of refugees who are seeking aid as they come into our country with their families and with hopeful spirits.

Before the new administration cut funding for Global Refuge's resettlement work with refugees, the organization's biggest problem was getting enough volunteers and co-sponsors for refugee arrivals. Andrew Steele, the Chief Development and Mobilization Officer with Global Refuge, said, "Now we still deal with those challenges, although they've been eclipsed by the sudden loss of federal funding support. We need to raise millions of dollars to meet the desperate needs of the refugees we serve."

He says refugees are "the most vetted people on the planet. We brought them here and now the government is saying, never mind, you're on your own."

What they need is Hearts of Mercy. Hearts that are willing to step up with prayer, financial support, activism, and volunteering. You can find volunteer opportunities at their local office on the Global Refuge website: www.globalrefuge.org. Because of lost funding, they've had to let staff go, and they need volunteers to continue their mission of greeting and assisting refugees as they resettle in a new country with a new language, customs, and unknowns. Will your Heart of Mercy be activated by this plea?

Global Refuge is in crisis. It requires Hearts of Mercy. Our congregation has a long history of sharing its merciful hearts with those in need, as Jesus would have us do. These words from Matthew 25:35-40 are our guidepost in Lent, and in everyday life. "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me."
