From the Pastor

From the Pastor . . . Hearts of Mercy

The yearly ritual of observing Holy Week invites us to reflect upon God's mercy in our lives. When Jesus enters Jerusalem, not in glory but on a donkey, we see the mercy of God's humility. We see a God who cares not for the riches or powers of this world, a God who values something else entirely. When Jesus washes the disciples' feet, we see the mercy of God's care for us. We see God's servant heart revealed, a God who seeks to lower himself in order that others might be lifted up. When Jesus breaks bread with his followers, we see the mercy of God's forgiveness, a God who brings reconciliation, peace, and community. When Jesus prays in the garden of Gethsemane and cries out from the cross, we see the mercy of God's solidarity with us, that in becoming human God reveals the deepest empathy the world has ever known and promises that he will never abandon us. When Jesus is betrayed, we see the mercy of God's grace, that no matter how many times we sin or how far astray we may go, we cannot separate ourselves from the God of love found in Jesus. When Jesus dies on the cross, we see the mercy of God's love, proclaiming even from that dark place that death and sin will not have the final word. When Jesus lies dead in the tomb, we see the mercy of God's hope, that even when all seems lost God is still at work, creating, redeeming, sustaining.

Easter Sunday arrives . . . and when we see the empty tomb, we piece together all these acts of mercy offered to a hurting yet hope-filled world. And as we reflect on God's boundless mercy and forgiveness offered in the life of Jesus, we are inspired to emulate those same gifts in our lives. Through the observance of Holy Week and hearing our most sacred stories, we are encouraged to reflect on God's mercy and cultivate hearts of compassion, emphasizing empathy, understanding, and grace in our interactions with others as Jesus first did for us.

We invite you to join us for Holy Week services as we receive and offer mercy.

What is a Refugee?

News reports referencing refugees, migrants, immigrants, and asylum seekers can be confusing. As we work together to help Global Refuge in a time of deep crisis, you might find this explanation to be helpful:

Migrants: People who move within their own country or across borders, usually for economic reasons. They are not forced to leave their country.

Immigrants: People who move from one country to another, for reasons such as better economic opportunities, family, or jobs.

Refugees: People who have been forced to flee their country due to conflict or persecution. They are unable or unwilling to return to their country of origin.

Asylum seekers: People who have left their country and are seeking protection from persecution and serious human rights violations in another country. They have not yet been legally recognized as a refugee.

Other pertinent information:

- Refugees are entitled to certain protections under the law.
- Signatories to the Geneva Conventions, like the United States, are obligated to take in refugees.
- Seeking asylum is a human right.
- Refugees may face dangerous journeys, exploitation by smugglers and human traffickers, and detention in inhospitable conditions.

When we are on the receiving end of mercy, we understand fully how powerfully it can change our lives for the better, which challenges us to be merciful with others. HOLY WEEK AT CLC



Palm Sunday Services will be held April 13 at 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. with livestream and Angelicus Choir singing at the 10:30 a.m. service. We celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem even as it points hauntingly to his ultimate betrayal, trial, crucifixion, and death. Palm processional, Holy Communion, and the Passion Reading will be at both services.

Maundy Thursday Service is a solemn and beautiful worship on April 17 at 7:00 p.m. in person and via livestream. Pastor Leslie will preach. This service, which includes Holy Communion, leads us to reflect on Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples. Here, gathering at the table and watching as Jesus kneels to wash the disciples' feet, we receive the absolution that was denied us on Ash Wednesday and the great commandment from Jesus that we love one another as he has loved us.

Good Friday Tenebrae Service on April 18 at 7:00 p.m. in person and via livestream will be a unique combination of scripture and music led by our talented and dedicated music staff and Sanctuary Choir.

Easter Services will celebrate our Lord's triumph over death through resurrection on Sunday, April 20, at 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. with livestream at 10:30 a.m. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! The services are nearly identical, although the 10:30 a.m. service will include a children's message. Pastor H will preach at both services, and both will include Holy Communion. Don't forget to bring flowers to place on the Resurrection Cross! An Easter Breakfast will be offered between the services, beginning at 9:15 a.m. Please join us as we celebrate!

Resurrection Flowering Cross

Christ Lutheran bursts into color with flowering crosses on the church lawn on Easter morning. The flowering cross is an especially striking and beautiful way to symbolize the new life that emerges on Easter morning after Jesus' death on Good Friday. The rough-hewn wood symbolizes the heavy cross on which Jesus died. The contrast between the starkly bare cross and the colorful transformation, when it is adorned with living flowers, is a dramatic, visual representation of the new life we celebrate. On Easter morning, we ask you to bring cut flowers for each member of your family (and more if you'd like to share) to place on our flowering crosses. It's a way our whole congregation can participate in and visualize the gift of Easter Sunday. For our visitors (and those of us who forget), we'll have extra flowers.

SEARCH FOR A NEW DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

Adam Braaten, Patti Lynch, Scott Merkord, Amanda Peterson, Natalie Stone (chair), Jeff Timm, and Jennifer von Durckheim, along with Pastor Leslie, have agreed to serve on our Search Committee to hire our next Director of Faith Formation. They met in March and reviewed/edited the job description for the position. They also spent time brainstorming about what type of gifts and skills we are looking for and what the needs and vision for our children's, youth, and family ministry will be into the future. Director of Faith Formation Job Description

"Our mission is to inspire and nurture children and youth to foster a lifelong relationship with God, the Christian church, and fellow followers of Jesus."

DESCRIPTION

The Director of Faith Formation serves the congregation by designing and implementing the children's, youth, and family ministries of the church, seeking to foster key relationships that will promote the development of faith in young people's lives. These relationships should be between the youth and adult mentors, among the youth themselves, and first and foremost be founded on a strong relationship with God.

Developing church leaders and members as volunteers is pivotal in this role. The Director will empower and equip existing and new leaders to create an impactful mentorship structure for children and youth through programming and relationship-building.

We are seeking a person of deep faith who has enthusiasm and passion for children and youth and a concern for their faith formation. Also, the Director should relate well to parents and understand that the most crucial aspects of discipleship and Christian teaching occur in the home, working alongside parents to encourage them in leading their children to know God.

DUTIES

- **Leadership**: The Director will set a strategic vision for children's and youth ministry and define key and consistent programming and ministry that will help achieve that vision.
- Teamwork: The Director will work alongside the Faith Formation Team, meeting regularly
 with them for planning and executing ministries, delegating events and areas of ministry as
 able and appropriate so that members take key leadership roles in children's, youth, and
 family ministry.
- Administration and Communication: The Director will develop and maintain a yearly budget and coordinate fundraising opportunities to offset ministry costs. The Director will attend weekly staff meetings, prepare an annual congregational report, and provide articles and updates through the church newsletter, Constant Contact, Sunday bulletins, the church website, regular mailings, and social media.
- Program Planning: The Director will be responsible for the administration of all children's, youth, and family programming (see list below). This will include preparing materials; volunteer recruiting, training, coordinating, and support; communication with parents and students; evaluating programs and curriculum, selecting and purchasing resources; building relationships with all ages; and some teaching.

- Relational Ministries: The Director will build crucial one-on-one relationships with all youth, children, and parents. The Director is encouraged to invest in our youth and children (e.g. taking a teenager out for coffee to "check-in", attending a basketball game or dance recital, eating lunch at school if allowed, etc.). The Director will model the Christian life by always conveying an attitude of grace and forgiveness, by worshiping regularly in our faith community, and by walking as a disciple of Jesus.
- **Children's Messages:** The Director will offer Children's Messages during Sunday worship on a regular basis, relaying messages focused on God's love and Christian discipleship in age-appropriate ways that allow children to engage and grow in their faith.
- **Day School:** The Director will help to coordinate and lead daily chapel for our Day School and ensure effective communication and teamwork between the ministries of the church and the Day School, including sending a weekly update on church ministry opportunities for the Day School to include in their communications.
- Continuing Education and Networking: The Director should attend gatherings of other professional youth leaders and build relationships with area colleagues. The Director is encouraged to attend continuing education opportunities and will receive financial support to do so.
