## From the Pastor

You must abandon your fear of each other and fear only God. You must not indulge in any deception and dishonesty, even to save your lives. Your words must be Yea'Nea; anything else is evil. Hatred is destructive to hated and hater alike. Love your enemy, that you may be children of your father who is in heaven. (Howard Thurman in Jesus and the Disinherited, Abingdon Press, 1949).

This quote from Dr. Howard Thurman's classic post-WWII prophetic book speaks eloquently to me, interpreting Jesus' Sermon on the Mount teachings in Matthew 5:43ff. Written at a time of acute racial injustice following the war, when Black Americans who served their country valiantly in uniform yet returned home to discrimination and even violence, I find Thurman's inspiring message as relevant in 2025 as it was in the mid-20<sup>th</sup> century.

I am the son of a combat veteran, and the brother of combat veterans. Most of my adult years were spent in uniform, defending the freedoms of the First Amendment with my life, but I see and read about the growing, perhaps irreversible changes in our democracy and wonder if my family's military service, and that of so many who gave their lives in defense of the Constitution, may be at grave risk.

Yet there is something of vastly greater value than even our nation's Constitution, as nation-states come and go. Though our temporal freedoms may be in decline, Matthew reminds us that what he identifies as the Kingdom of Heaven is eternal. Leaders and tyrants may arise for a time, perhaps longer than my own life expectancy, but Jesus calls us to "fear only God." As followers of Jesus, we are called to avoid "any deception or dishonesty," even at the cost of our physical lives. Hate for other persons created in the divine image can destroy all of us.

Loving one's enemy does not mean approving of their behaviors, nor engaging in violence or sin oneself. It does mean aspiring to the Kingdom where no corruption destroys, nor thief can break in and steal. I take heart that working for justice is "God's Work – Our Hands." Being an advocate for migrant persons seeking refuge from certain death or suffering, bringing their families from places of torment to the hope of our shores: this is God's work. Seeking justice for those already in this country, regardless of their heritage or language, is simply seeing others as persons for whom Christ died.

As we celebrate our national heritage on this July 4<sup>th</sup>, embrace the positive values of our country, realizing all the while that nations are for a time, but the Kingdom of Heaven is for eternity. Work for justice and decency in this temporal space we fondly call home. Lay claim for eternity in Jesus' assurance that ". . . we may be children of our Father who is in Heaven."




### **UPCOMING EVENTS**
