From the Pastor

On Religious Tolerance

I've never cared much for this term — "religious tolerance." Tolerance sounds to me more like a medical term, related to something unpleasant, but necessary. Think chemotherapy, or more commonly, a colonoscopy, or time spent with an endodontist performing a root canal. These are very important, even life-preserving procedures, but often the best thing care providers can say thereafter is that a patient "tolerated" the procedure well.

Regarding spiritual matters and faith, tolerance implies that one merely endures or suffers through time with others who may see spiritual things differently. Time has taught me that life is vastly more joyful and expansive when we see different faith traditions as potential opportunities to view God and the world from a new perspective.

I am a life-long Lutheran, baptized, confirmed, married in the church, educated and ordained into a ministry that now stretches past 50 years. I treasure all that my tradition has taught me. Our confessional emphasis on "salvation by grace through faith" is a Biblical verity that saturates our worship and life together. Experience has also taught me that hearing other points of view, including those beyond the Christian tradition, bears no resemblance to an under-anesthetized colonoscopy. Listening to a neighbor's faith, while restraining myself from my own judgments of orthodoxy, has lengthened my spiritual depth of field. The Lutheran church I treasure does not lay claim to all truth under heaven.

Working in an inter-faith setting for most of my adult life has taught me that respect is more spiritually edifying and community-building than tolerance. Learning to listen to another can bring people together. People are more likely to honor my faith and spiritual tradition if I first honor theirs. Sincerely held beliefs that also recognize the broad varieties of religious experience can bring healing to our fractured nation and world.

In this season of my life, and in the renewal of our programmatic ministries at Christ Lutheran Church, I will certainly celebrate our Lutheran heritage. May we also venture beyond tolerance toward respecting and celebrating the spiritual traditions of others, perceiving God's creative and healing hand at work beyond our walls.

All Saints Sunday & Dia de los Muertos Remembrance Sunday, November 2, Fellowship Hall and Sanctuary



The traditions of All Saints and *Dia de los Muertos* are beloved at Christ Lutheran. They allow us to gather and remember, grieve, celebrate, and find solace and hope. During worship at 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. you will find our All Saints Altar at the front of the church, surrounding the font, reminding us of our baptismal promises that no matter what, even in death, we are forever held in love by God. You are invited to bring pictures and mementos of loved ones to place on the altar throughout the morning. There you will also see candles strewn across the table that will be lighted during worship in remembrance of the saints who have gone before us. A special bell will toll

in memory of all those members and friends of our community of faith who have died since our last All Saints remembrance, as we lift their names in prayer. If you would like to submit the name of someone you love who has died in the past year, please contact the church office.

Between worship services, during our education hour, we will continue our remembering by sharing stories of our sainted loved ones and creating projects in their memory. Again, please bring pictures and mementos to share and to place on our *Dia de los Muertos* Altar. We will close our time together with a brief service of remembrance.

For a little background on this colorful, meaningful celebration:

El Día de los Muertos is a unique cultural tradition that remembers those loved ones who have gone before us. It is

an annual three-day Mexican festival where family and friends remember the dearly departed. It is a vibrant celebration of life that gives artistic expression to mourning through music, color, dance, food, art, flowers, and more. The dead are celebrated literally as though still alive and *ofrendas* or "offerings" are made in memory of them and their favorite sports, foods, drinks, and pastimes. *Calaveras literarias* are poems written for the dead to celebrate their life and remember them. Mexico's *Día de los Muertos* inspires us to enrich our own tradition of remembering the saints who are dear to us.

Day School Sunday and Honoring Gloria Meyer Sunday, October 5, 10:30 a.m. Worship Service



Our wonderful Christ Lutheran Day School has launched thousands of children on their faith and learning journey over the 70 years they have served our community. We celebrate Day School Sunday every year, and this year we also celebrate Gloria Meyer. Gloria, a longtime choir participant and active member of our congregation, is one of the longest-term teachers/directors/volunteers who has made a loving impact on the kiddos. We are honoring Gloria for her many years of dedicated service that began in 1978 when she taught her first class. Over the years, as she accompanied her husband Greg on his US Army assignments and his post-retirement work as a contractor with the USAF, she has left San Antonio and the Day School several times. But each time the Meyers returned to

San Antonio, she gravitated back to the Day School that she loves. During those times, she served as a teacher, and for three years, she was the Director. When she returned to San Antonio in 2005, she began lending her talents as a pianist to the daily chapel services — a 20-year volunteer commitment that has helped little ones learn songs that tell the story of God's faithful love. With that longevity, she has inspired generations of students and, often, the children of former students.

On October 5, we will honor Gloria at the 10:30 a.m. worship service to thank her for nearly five decades of ministry, and we'll host a reception in her honor following the service. Day School Director, Dana Ferraro, and Assistant Director, Kelsey Shaw, will also be with us to help recognize Gloria. They will share with us an update on the school and invite us after worship on a tour of the school's classrooms, where we can see the love of God in action in service to these sweet little souls.


Inner City Development - Christmas Toy Sale

CLC's benevolence partner, Inner City Development, brings Christmas cheer to its neighbors in one of San Antonio's lowest income neighborhoods. Inner City asks friends to help them set up a Christmas store at their community center at 1300 Chihuahua Street in 78207. This year, Inner City Development will be our Christmas community outreach project – giving needy families a boost so they can afford to buy shiny new gifts for their kiddos.

They're asking for new toys, dolls, balls, arts and crafts, puzzles, baby toys, books, games, bikes, and athletic equipment that they will then "sell" to neighbors from their festive pop-up store at the Inner City community center. Shoppers pay at a 90% discount . . . or whatever they can afford. It brings dignity and joy to families who want to give their children a Merry Christmas but cannot otherwise afford to do so. (Note: They ask that we please not supply any toys or games that promote violence.) Last year, over 700 children benefitted from the Christmas sale, and the funds raised are used to provide emergency services for the families served by Inner City.

Toys should not be gift-wrapped. We will deliver them to Inner City on Saturday, December 13, and ask that you bring your contributions to the church by Sunday, December 7, and mark them "Inner City Development." Thank you for caring, sharing, and generously bringing Christmas joy to struggling families in our community.
