From the Pastor . . .

Jesus and the Hebrew Scriptures: It's all about justice.

As we read through the Bible each year in our Sunday morning lectionary, we often read of Jesus quoting the Hebrew Bible (Old Testament). Jesus was deeply familiar with the sacred writings of his Jewish faith. Most commonly, Jesus quoted the Prophets and the Psalms. The Gospel writers make clear that Jesus was a literate rabbi (teacher) of the Hebrew Bible (Luke 4:16-17).

Throughout his earthly ministry, Jesus emphasized especially two themes of the Hebrew prophets: justice and righteousness. The Biblical justice of which Jesus spoke described the establishment or restoration of fairness, equitable, and harmonious relationships among all people, regardless of their age, gender, or their religious or ethnic backgrounds. This was a strong message to those who bore generational suspicions of individuals or groups "other" than one's own. It still is.

Jesus also preached the Hebrew virtue of righteousness, which focuses on behaviors that attend to the responsibilities of our relationships, whether with God or with one another. Persons of faith cannot separate justice and righteousness. Both are based on our relationships with God and with others in the societies in which we live.

In our Lutheran tradition, we seek to balance the law and the gospel – rules and salvation by grace. As we begin this new year, I am prayerful that we attend to matters of justice and righteousness not only because they are rules set down in the Scriptures, but because they are opportunities for us to be witnesses for Jesus in daily living.

It is not a "chore" or burden to support the Food Bank, but an opportunity to serve our neighbors in San Antonio who may need a hand this coming year. It won't be a demand that we contribute to Global Refuge (formerly Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services) but rather a chance to welcome an immigrant family. It can be a celebration of faith to embrace a new arrival to our community who risked all they had to find freedom and safety with us in our country.

The year 2026 will offer occasions to share the faith in ways obedient to our Lord's provision of opportunity: to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly (Micah 6:8). As we open our hearts and homes to advance justice, doing so, not in obligation but in joy, will be living in true righteousness.

Mission and Outreach Update

There's an old camp song that starts, "It only takes a spark to get a fire going, and soon all those around will warm up to its glowing . . ." Sometimes that is how I feel about Mission and Outreach. We don't always see the acts of kindness that people do, but through these sparks God is working to create warmth and hope for others, and as each act of service or love is added to this fire, each person who experiences it wants to pass it on. As we are beginning the new year of 2026, I am thinking about how all the small gifts and contributions that our congregation has given have amounted to something greater together. These gestures of hope and love have fed our neighbors, kept them warm, encouraged them, given them greater opportunity, and joy.

This was true especially at Christmas time when we donated toys to Inner City Development for their toy store. Jan Schubert and I loaded up our cars with the toys our congregation so generously donated, and we delivered them to Inner City. What a joyful sight – volunteers from the neighborhood and other churches were sorting and displaying toys, games, bicycles, baby toys, puzzles, sports equipment, and arts and crafts. Each section looked like a real toy store. We could imagine the happy families coming by the next day to shop for their kiddos at a 90% discount! And while we were there, a Harlandale ISD school bus dropped off a bunch of teenagers from Upward Bound who came to help. A true community project.

We also collected baby items for a vulnerable family. When we are treating the least of these with care, so are we welcoming Jesus into our midst. I'm looking forward to how we can respond to our neighbors in this new year. We are going to start by having a food drive for the Food Bank in January and organizing another volunteer opportunity to feed the hungry in February, so watch for more on these upcoming events.

Another recent venture has been our participation in a project, Tapestry of Care, hosted by the Congregational Collective, which aims to equip our congregations to respond to those struggling with mental health issues, as a safe and welcoming place to go and receive support as well as resources/referrals. Through this project not only are we hoping to increase access to those who need it, but to transform how we see our neighbor, not as someone who is "other" but as a companion, a friend, in which there is mutuality and love. We have formed a team around this mission to love our neighbors and will be sharing more information about the trainings that are available. 1. Everyone donates Kraft Mac and Cheese in a box. They can rarely use it because it needs milk and butter which are hard to get from regular food banks.
2. Boxed milk is a treasure, as kids need it for cereal which they also get a lot of.
3. Everyone donates pasta sauce and spaghetti noodles.
4. They cannot eat all the awesome canned veggies and soup unless you include a can opener or buy pop tops.
5. Oil is a luxury but needed for Rice a Roni and other donated foods.
6. Spices, salt, and pepper would be a real Christmas gift.
7. Tea bags and coffee make them feel like you care.
8. Sugar and flour are treats.
9. They fawn over fresh produce donated by farmers and grocery stores.
10. Seeds are cool in spring and summer because growing can be easy for some.
11. Tuna and crackers make a good lunch.
12. They get lots of peanut butter and jelly but usually not sandwich bread.
13. Cake mix and frosting make it possible to make a child's birthday cake.
14. Dishwashing detergent is very expensive and is always appreciated.
15. Feminine hygiene products are a luxury, and women will cry over that.
16. Everyone loves Stove Top Stuffing.

We also gathered for an **Advent Festival**, where youth explored global Advent traditions through hands-on activities, food, and fellowship.

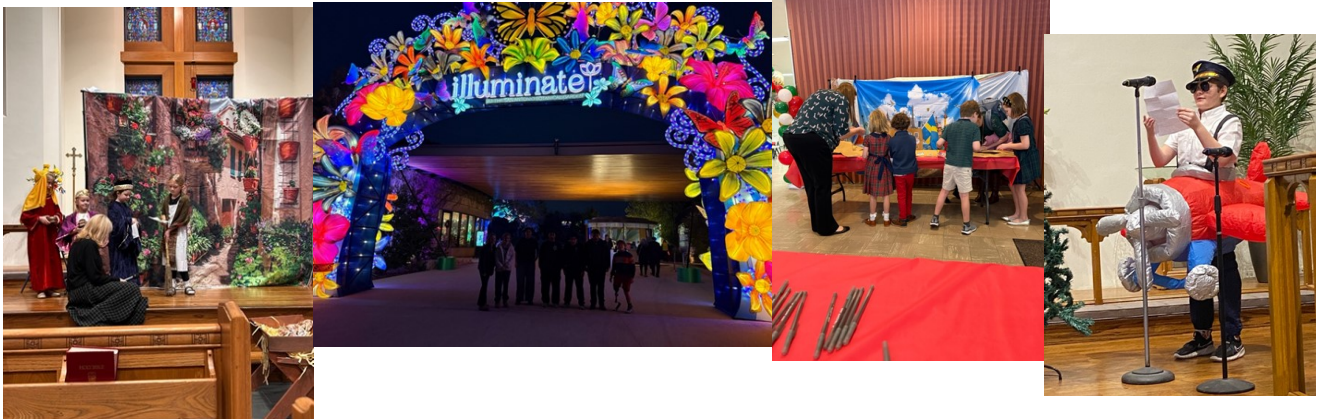
