From the Pastor . . . All the Earth is Hopeful

Advent is a season of waiting. We wait for the coming of baby Jesus. We wait expectantly, knowing that Jesus will indeed arrive in the manger come Christmas Eve, celebrated in our beloved traditions of carols and candlelight. We know that this part of the story has a good ending, and as such the story of the birth of the Christ child gifts us with hope.

Another part of Advent waiting is waiting in the midst of what theologians call the “now and not yet.” We live in the “now” of celebrating Christ’s advent on Earth in the Christmas story which fully ends in the glory of Easter, but we also live in the “not yet” of awaiting the time when God will make all things new, bringing his kingdom to its fullness, ending suffering and struggle, revealing true peace and justice, and redeeming us all.

We are caught in the middle, caught between the “now” and the “not yet,” hoping that the ending will be as good as the Christmas story, but sometimes doubting that such a glorious end is possible. Indeed, it’s hard not knowing how the story will end.

The famous characters Frodo Baggins and Samwise Gamgee felt similarly. In the film adaptation of J.R.R. Tolkien’s second novel in *The Lord of the Rings* trilogy, the iconic pair shares this vulnerable dialogue as they journey on their dangerous quest to destroy the ring of power.

Frodo: *I can’t do this, Sam.*

Sam: *I know. It’s all wrong. By rights we shouldn’t even be here. But we are. It’s like in the great stories, Mr. Frodo. The ones that really mattered. Full of darkness and danger they were. And sometimes you didn’t want to know the end. Because how could the end be happy? How could the world go back to the way it was when so much bad had happened?*

But in the end, it’s only a passing thing, this shadow. Even darkness must pass. A new day will come. And when the sun shines it will shine out the clearer. Those were the stories that stayed with you. That meant something. Even if you were too small to understand why. But I think, Mr. Frodo, I do understand. I know now. Folk in those stories had lots of chances of turning back only they didn’t. Because they were holding on to something.

FRODO: *What are we holding on to, Sam?*

SAM: *That there’s some good in this world, Mr. Frodo. And it’s worth fighting for.*

Dear friends, what are we holding on to?

If there is anything that the birth, life, and death of Jesus teach us, it is that there is indeed some good in the world, and it is most definitely worth fighting for. In fact, Jesus is infinite goodness incarnate in the world. And the goodness he reveals throughout his life and ministry inspires us toward love. Even more, his belief that goodness is worth striving for cost him all but also gave us everything we would ever need – unbounded love leading to the reconciliation of us with God and with one another. The Christmas story means that all the Earth is hopeful. We can live faithfully in the midst, trusting that the end of the story is held securely in God’s hands.

Our Christmas Benevolence Partner! Inner City Development's Christmas Toy Sale

One of CLC's beloved benevolence partners, Inner City Development, brings Christmas cheer to its neighbors in one of San Antonio's lowest income neighborhoods every year, and Christ Lutheran is on board to support this merry happening. This year, Inner City Development will be our Christmas community outreach project—giving needy families a boost so they can buy shiny new gifts for their kiddos.

Inner City invites friends to help them set up a Christmas store at their community center at 1300 Chihuahua Street in 78207. They're asking for new toys, dolls, balls, arts and crafts, puzzles, baby toys, books, games, bikes, and athletic equipment that they will then "sell" to neighbors from their festive pop-up store at the Inner City community center. Shoppers pay at a 90% discount . . . or whatever they can afford. It brings dignity and joy to families who want to give their children a Merry Christmas but cannot otherwise afford to do so. (Note: They ask that we please not supply any toys or games that promote violence.)

Last year, over 700 children benefitted from the Christmas sale, and the funds raised are used to provide emergency services for the families served by Inner City.

Toys should not be gift-wrapped. We will deliver to Inner City on Saturday, December 13, and ask that you bring your contributions to the CrossWay by Thursday, December 11, and mark them "Inner City Development."

Thank you for caring, sharing, and generously bringing Christmas joy to struggling families in our community.

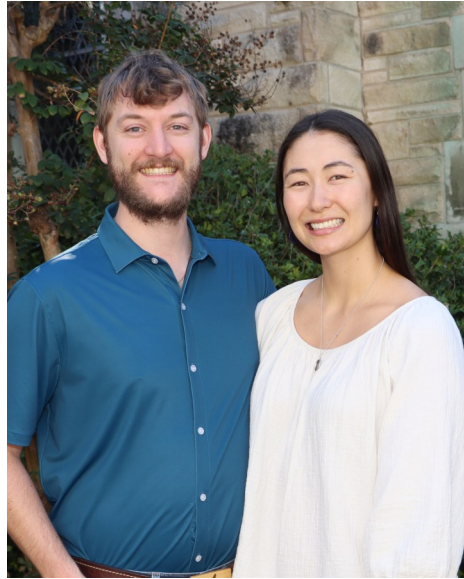

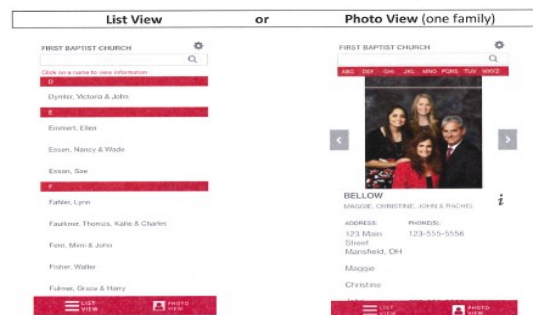

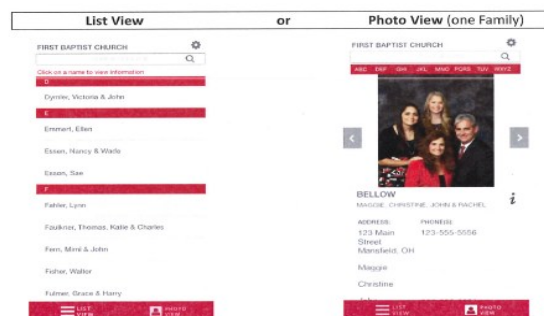

December is going to be an exciting and busy month for the youth of Christ Lutheran! As we enter the Advent season, we'll be learning how Christmas is celebrated around the world.

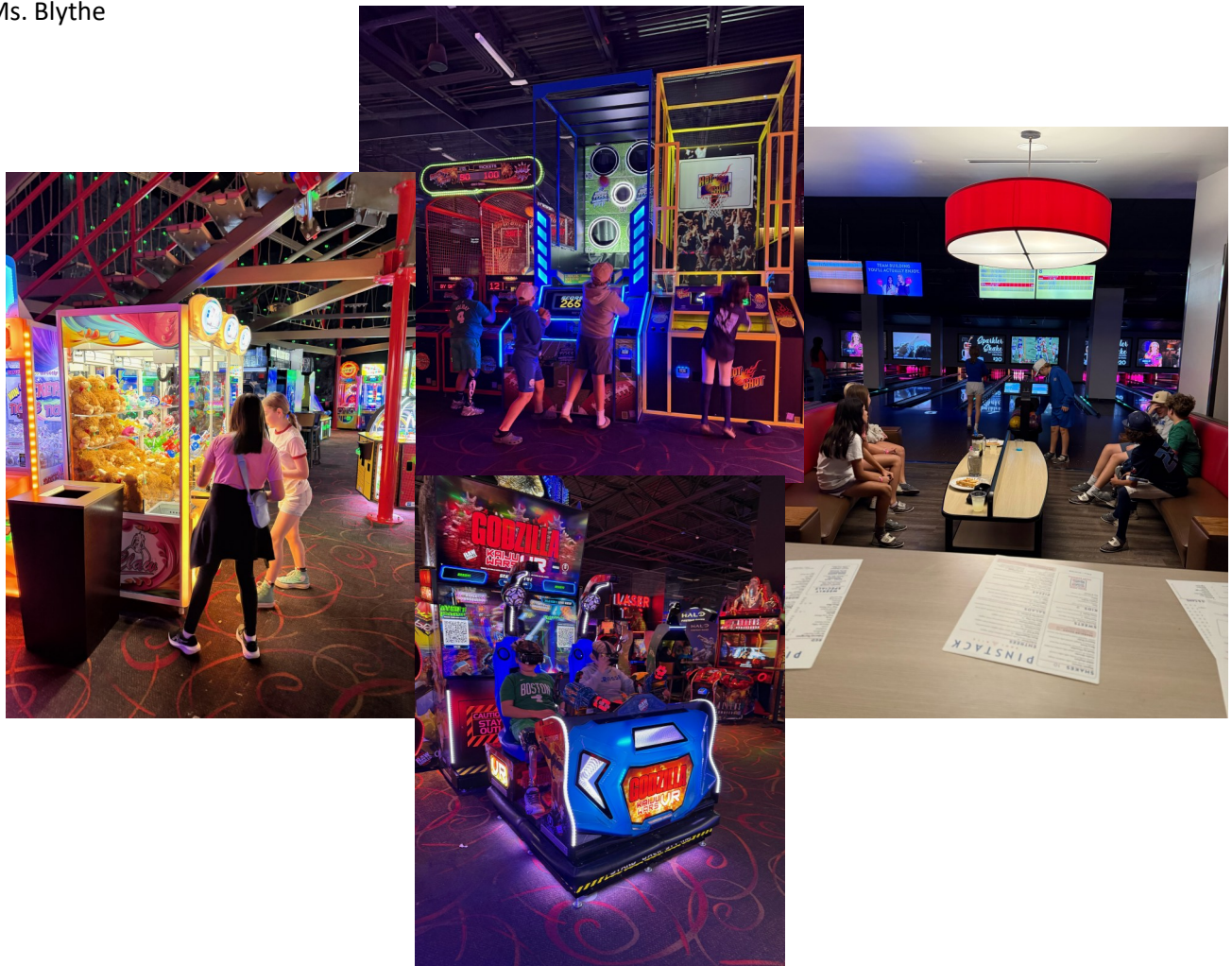

COMMUNITY MINISTRY UPDATE

St. Luke's Lutheran Health Ministries Awards \$207,000 in Grants to Area Non-Profit Healthcare Organizations

St. Luke's Lutheran Health Ministries (SLLHM), a ministry of the Southwestern Texas Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, has awarded \$207,000 in grants to 28 non-profit healthcare organizations in Bexar and surrounding counties in its semi-annual grant cycle. The grants range from \$2,500 to \$20,000, benefitting organizations providing medical/mental/dental care, equipment and supplies related to care, and education/prevention/wellness initiatives.

Members of Christ Lutheran have a long history of service on the Board of SLLHM. Currently serving on the Board are Adam Braaten, Jan Schubert Norris, Laura O'Donnell, Pastor Dave Schulte, and Pastor Howard Stendahl.

Xavier Rodriguez, U.S. District Judge for the Western District of Texas, is current President of the SLLHM Board of Directors. He noted, "In these challenging economic times, St. Luke's is grateful for the opportunity to support organizations that are providing care and hope to uninsured and under-insured children, families, and seniors who are suffering from a broad range of health issues. We are raising awareness of the deep needs in our community and invite congregational gifts to help us continue our 31 years of support to neighbors in need."

Grants are awarded in two cycles – spring and fall – and since its founding, SLLHM has bolstered the work of its charitable partners by \$12,391,748.

SLLHM continues the tradition of its mission successor, St. Luke's Lutheran Hospital, founded in 1976 to provide comfort, hope, and healing to the ill and suffering. When the hospital was sold to the Baptist Health System in 1994, SLLHM was founded using the proceeds of the sale to continue the hospital's legacy of caring for the health of the community.

A high-impact grant of \$20,000 was awarded to the Center for Health Empowerment in South Texas (CHEST), which is dedicated to advancing the health access and outcomes for under-served residents in the five City Council districts with the most uninsured residents, the highest poverty levels, lowest income levels, and least access to healthcare.

Your tax-deductible contributions to St. Luke's enhance the effect of your gifts by combining your dollars with St. Luke's resources. The St. Luke's board practices due diligence, makes site visits to every requesting organization and follows up to ensure appropriate utilization of grants.
