From the Pastor . . . The Good News is . . .

There have been many sobering headlines lately. The daily onslaught of challenging news stories keeps coming. It's the kind of news that stays with us . . . the kind that riles our brain, the kind that hurts our heart, the kind that makes our whole bodies weary. The world shifts underneath our feet and before our eyes, and we fail to make sense of any of it.

One common response to our inability to control the growing chaos, violence, and injustice, is to turn inward upon ourselves. To berate ourselves for not doing enough, to feel as though it's our fault. We think . . . if I were a better disciple of Jesus, I wouldn't be so afraid to speak up about what I see taking place . . . or if I were better engaged in practicing my faith, I would know what to do in this moment and I would do it . . . or if I were a better Christian, I would be doing more. As I wrote above, this is a common response. You are not alone. I'm hoping, in fact, that most of us are wondering what more we could be doing, because from the obvious depth of these problems, it's going to take all of us working together to bring change.

But at the same time, I don't want you to berate yourselves. You are rightly perplexed, distraught, and afraid. You are indeed experiencing growing violence and hatred and vitriol and division. You are hearing opposing voices silenced. You are seeing compassion and empathy cast aside.

In the midst of this, our church calendar trudges ahead. Unaware of these current events and complexities, the season of Lent arrives, proclaiming a lasting word which supersedes every time and place . . . the *Good News*. Lent and Holy Week walk us through our most sacred stories; they tell of Jesus, his teachings, his ministry, his witness, his life, his suffering, his death, and ultimately his resurrection beyond the sinful powers of this world. Ash Wednesday, and each Sunday in Lent and Holy Week, we will hear about this *Good News of Jesus*, that the *Good News* is:

- All are invited.
- So good it catches us by surprise.
- Great love for God and neighbor.
- Together, the impossible is possible.
- Protection and care for the vulnerable.
- Rooted in justice, mercy, and faithfulness.
- Inspiring us to act.
- Alive in the world.

As we journey throughout this Lenten season together, looking toward our Lord's passion, we will be regularly reminded that discipleship is not perfection. Discipleship does not mean the absence of fear. Discipleship does not mean we have it all under control or figured out. At the same time, discipleship does require that we stay *engaged* with the world in which we live, however troubled it may be. It requires that we remember there are things which we can do, however small or inadequate they may seem to us. It requires that even when we are overwhelmed or feel insufficient, we not give in to despair, but instead consider what is possible within the real limitations we face. It requires us to continue to care for our neighbors who are hurting, in need, and vulnerable.

So, if you need someone to tell you something good right now, come to church this Lent. Jesus knows just what to say, he will ground us in the *Good News* so that we might go out and spread that hopeful word.

Lenten Worship Recipient: Clarity Child Guidance Center

The Good News is . . . your Lenten worship funds will give hope and help to children with mental health issues.

Christ Lutheran's 2026 Lenten theme, "*The Good News is . . .*" is inspiring us to reach out to children with mental health issues. We have selected Clarity Child Guidance Center as the designated recipient of our Lenten worship funds. Each Wednesday during Lent, beginning with Ash Wednesday on February 18, 100% of your Lenten Wednesday offerings will be given to Clarity to support their critical work.

A statewide study on mental health in 2022 determined that 140,000 people in Bexar County were living with serious mental illness in need of treatment. The Center for Healthcare Services, which provides integrated care to children and adults with mental health, has the capacity to serve only 38,000. What happens to the other 100,000+ who are suffering?

The Good News for children and families is that we have, in our city, the only nonprofit mental health treatment center for kids ages 3 to 17 in all South Texas. Clarity Child Guidance stemmed from an 1886 initiative formed by 13 women who launched the predecessor of Clarity – the Protestant Home for Destitute Children. That start led to several iterations over the decades, and is now known as Clarity Child Guidance Center.

Why is this important? And why has Christ Lutheran chosen Clarity to be the recipient of our Lenten worship offerings? Mental illness has risen to the forefront of health concerns in America following the Covid pandemic. NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) cites this statistic: 50% of mental illness begins by age 14; 75% by age 24.

Clarity is reaching children in their formative years, using proven practices and treatments to ensure children get the help they need to fend off serious crises. Clarity Child Guidance Center provides crisis services, inpatient treatment, partial hospitalization, and outpatient treatment. This not-for-profit center treats all kids regardless of race, gender, ethnicity, socioeconomics or their ability to pay.

Their mission is to support children and families in their pursuit of mental wellness.

Children want to overcome their problems, but many don't know how. Clarity's goal is to work with kids and families to discover obstacles and remove roadblocks. Their diverse programs equip children with the tools they need to become healthy, happy, and successful in life.

The Good News is our dollars can make a difference in the life of a child and family dealing with the distress and heartbreak of serious mental illness.

Jesus' final days were full of risk. Every move he made was filled with anticipation, danger, and the potential for great loss or great reward. Jesus risked his reputation when he entered Jerusalem in a victory parade. He risked his life when he dared to teach in the Temple. His followers risked everything when they left behind their homes or anointed him with costly perfume. We take risks as we read and re-read these stories, finding new meanings and new challenges.

In the book *Entering the Passion of Jesus: A Beginner's Guide to Holy Week*, author, professor, and biblical scholar Dr. Amy-Jill Levine explores the biblical texts surrounding the Passion story. She shows us how the text raises ethical and spiritual questions for the reader, and how we all face risk in our Christian experience. Pastor Leslie will lead us in conversation around this work, utilizing the book and a series of videos Dr. Levine produces to accompany it. Feel free to purchase and read the book if you would like, but it isn't necessary for the class.

Children and Youth Sunday School, 9:30 a.m.

We encourage our children to participate in our Sunday School programs here at CLC. All ages will meet in the children's chapel for a daily message and song followed by breakout groups by age. Confirmands will meet with Ms. Blythe to dive further into the information discussed within each confirmation unit. They will have group discussions on topics covered and explore more about their faith.

Mission and Outreach Update

Greetings friends! Because of the recent food shortage experienced by the San Antonio Food Bank, in November, when the Mission and Outreach Team met, we decided to support the Food Bank by holding a food drive during the month of January. Kelly King, Interfaith Engagement Manager for the Food Bank, invited us for a tour of the facility, and 11 of us were able to join from CLC. We learned about all their programs and services. Amazingly, \$1 donated to this non-profit is enough to cover seven meals, and they feed 105,000 persons per week. Food is distributed to local pantries, mobile pop-ups, and directly from the Food Bank mobile market. They also collect pet food for their Daisy Care's program. They participate in the Ready to Work program, which provides six to ten weeks of vocational training, and they offer case management to seniors and veterans through their neighborly services program. They also have 30 acres of rural farmland and a Community Kitchen for Pre-K for SA. During the summer weeks, 55,000 meals were served by their summer feeding program.

Care Kits for Our Homeless Neighbors

Many of us are uncomfortable in the presence of extreme suffering. Homelessness qualifies as extreme suffering. When we stop at an intersection and see a homeless person asking for help, we often turn away, not knowing what to do. It's awkward and leaves us feeling uneasy and perhaps ashamed.

Several members of our congregation are involved in The Congregational Collective, an outreach ministry hosted by the H.E. Butt Foundation with a mission to help people with mental health challenges to find community and support from local faith communities without stigma.

After attending several sessions and meeting with congregational leaders of all faiths, Christ Lutheran is launching its first initiative – distributing care kits to our homeless neighbors.

We hope to make this a congregation-wide activity, involving all interested members, including our Sunday School children, as well as our Day School children. This month and next, we'll be collecting items (listed below) to fill the care kits, and on Sunday, March 15, all ages will meet in the Fellowship Hall to fill the bags. We are asking that members who wish to participate take one or two of the care kits and keep them in their cars to hand out when they see a homeless person or someone who appears to be suffering. In addition to the items listed here, we will include a list of available resources and a handmade card from our congregation's and Day School's children, reminding folks that "Jesus loves you, and so do we."

We hope you'll report back to us. How did it feel to engage with a stranger in this manner? How did the recipient respond? What more can we do? Lots of good things are ahead, and I'm excited for what's next!


