Thoughts on Lent. . .

I wondered to myself recently, what would I say if something asked me to explain the season of Lent? I would tell them Lent is a church season where we see and feel the contrast between light and dark. We see and feel the duality of both pain and hope. Have you noticed how light looks brighter when we come out of a dark room? Jesus came among us and died so that he could share our experience, so that he could empathize with our pain and our dark times. And he rose as a source of blinding light in our lives—a constant light to remind us we are not alone.

I recently heard someone say that as people of faith, we are called to fight against despair. Is that in fact our duty? But despair feels so tempting; I give into it more often than I'd like to admit. I wallow on the couch in self-pity or I have a "let it all out," sobbing cry session. But when I come down from those intense moments, I find myself left with no choice but to pick up again with hope. Hope, however small, is the glimmer of light that allows me to go on living from day to day.

But where do we find hope? How do we cultivate it in our lives, our families, and our community—especially in the midst of unjust, difficult times? I can only share what works for me. I want to emphasize the word *work*, because it takes intention to keep the fire of hope burning. Psychologists explain that humans are biased to look for what is going wrong, rather than what is going right. It's a survival instinct. But I would argue that we need hope to survive, too.

A beloved friend once used a metaphor about panning for gold to describe the search for hope in the world. He said when people panned for gold long ago, they used a small pan with holes to sift through the mud. More often than not, they found small flecks rather than large pieces. Finding a big piece and getting rich quick was rare; it was the cumulative collection of those flecks that added up to something valuable. Similarly, he advised me to look for those small but visible pieces of joy in my own life. So, I started the work of noticing—the stranger who put my cart away when they saw me overwhelmed with two kids, the job raise that came just in time to pay the plumbing bill, the friend who took time to check on me. Some days it's harder to find those flecks of gold. I have to dig deep and remember less obvious things that I take for granted. A shower means I have hot, clean water. The challenges of raising two children come from the blessing of being able to have two healthy children. And I frequently forget that I have a heavenly parent who loves me without condition. He loves me when I'm grateful and he loves me when I give in to despair. He has filled my life with flecks of gold, and they are there for me to discover when I remember to stop and look.

As we move through the Lenten season, I invite you to look around in your life for those flecks of gold, however small. Ask God to help you notice his blessings all around you. I pray that these practices anchor you and give you the strength to carry on.

Prayer from Kate Bowler:

God, give me grace to hand over my heavy heart, weighed down by all that I can't handle myself. Come into this small and helpless place where I live in the confines of uncertainty. Be with me and comfort me. Show me what choices I still have left. That there may be joy in them. Amen.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION CORNER

Faith University on Sundays in April, 9:30 a.m., Fellowship Hall

April 5 – Join us for a festive Easter Breakfast complete with an Egg Hunt for the children!

April 19 – We will have an opportunity to hear from Sister Denise LaRock, Daughter of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul, about families in detention. For many years she's worked with immigrants and asylum seekers, and has kindly offered to share her experiences so that we can better understand what's happening and how we might support this work.

April 26 – Entering the Passion of Jesus - Jesus' final days were full of risk. Every move he made was filled with anticipation, danger, and the potential for great loss or great reward. Jesus risked his reputation when he entered Jerusalem in a victory parade. He risked his life when he dared to teach in the Temple. His followers risked everything when they left behind their homes or anointed him with costly perfume. We take risks as we read and re-read these stories, finding new meanings and new challenges.

In the book *Entering the Passion of Jesus: A Beginner's Guide to Holy Week*, author, professor, and biblical scholar Dr. Amy-Jill Levine explores the biblical texts surrounding the Passion story. She shows us how the text raises ethical and spiritual questions for the reader, and how we all face risk in our Christian experience. Pastor Leslie will lead us in conversation around this work, utilizing the book and a series of videos Dr. Levine produces to accompany it. Feel free to purchase and read the book if you would like, but it isn't necessary for the class.

Children & Youth Sunday School, 9:30 a.m.

We encourage our children to participate in our Sunday School programs here at CLC. All ages will meet in the children's chapel for a message and song followed by breakout groups by age. Sunday School is led by our faithful and amazing church members along with the Director of Faith Formation, Blythe Boeck.

Preschool (3 years old - Kindergarten)

We will jump into the wonder of learning the Bible stories through the Godly Play curriculum. Patti Lynch, Beth Whitten, and Deacon Lisa Diana will be the lead Sunday school teachers for this class.

Elementary (1st - 5th Grades)

Students explore the great stories of the Bible through storytelling and art. Rhonda Barsalou and Natalie Stone will lead storytelling through the Old Testament, focusing on a different story each week, and Suz Braaten, Scott Merkord, and Elizabeth Yust will lead the art component.

Confirmation (6th - 8th Grades)

Confirmands will meet with Ms. Blythe to dive further into the information discussed within each confirmation unit. They will have group discussions on topics covered and explore more about their faith.

HOLY WEEK AT CLC

Maundy Thursday Service is a solemn and beautiful worship on April 2 at 7:00 p.m. Deacon Lisa will preach. This service, which includes Holy Communion, leads us to reflect on Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples. Gathering at the table and watching as Jesus kneels to wash the disciples' feet, we receive the absolution that was denied us on Ash Wednesday and the great commandment from Jesus that we love one another as he has loved us.

Good Friday Tenebrae Service on April 3 at 7:00 p.m. will be a unique combination of scripture and music led by our talented and dedicated music staff and Sanctuary Choir.

Easter Services will celebrate our Lord's triumph over death through resurrection on Sunday, April 5, at 8:30 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! The services are nearly identical, although the 10:30 a.m. service will include a children's message. Pastor Leslie will preach at both services, and both will include Holy Communion. Don't forget to bring flowers to place on the Resurrection Cross. An Easter Breakfast will be offered between the services, beginning at 9:15 a.m. Please join us as we celebrate!

Resurrection Flowering Crosses

Christ Lutheran bursts into color with flowering crosses on the church lawn on Easter morning. The flowering cross is an especially striking and beautiful way to symbolize the new life that emerges on Easter morning after Jesus' death on Good Friday. The rough-hewn wood symbolizes the heavy cross on which Jesus died. The contrast between the starkly bare crosses and the colorful crosses adorned with living flowers, is a dramatic, visual representation of the new life we celebrate. On Easter morning, we ask you to bring cut flowers for each member of your family (and more if you'd like to share) to place on our flowering crosses. It's a way for our whole congregation to participate in, and visualize, the gift of Easter Sunday. We'll have extra flowers for visitors (and those of us who forget).

MISSION AND OUTREACH

Lenten Worship Recipient: Clarity Child Guidance Center

The Centers for Disease Control reports that suicide is the second leading cause of death for individuals ages 10-34 years of age. The Children's Hospital Association reports that 6,400 youth ages 10-24 die by suicide each year in the U.S. This is a crisis, as recently seen in Bexar County with the tragic death of 19-year-old Camila Mendoza Olmos and other child suicide deaths in Bexar County in 2025.

Clarity Child Guidance Center offers hope and healing for young people suffering from mental health issues. Melissa Mireles, Chief Marketing & Development Officer, says, "Clarity Child Guidance is here to help, providing access to mental health care for all children and adolescents." Their professional partnerships are an assurance of quality care. "We partner with the UT Health Child and Adolescent Psychiatric Residency Health program, and with Southwest Psychiatric Physicians. Clarity is a teaching hospital, where UT Health psychiatry residents get part of their training by working with Clarity patients. We also have pre-doctoral psychology students in our program as well as partnerships with three nursing schools. Nursing students rotate through our campus for the mental health segment of their training."

Inpatient treatment stabilizes children in crisis who need immediate care and require continuous supervision. Clarity's eight-acre campus has five units with 74 beds. Patients receive a treatment plan that includes an ongoing evaluation, therapy, and 24-hour nursing care under the supervision of a physician.

In the event of a medical emergency, call 911. For an off-hours mental health crisis, visit their 24/7, walk-in Crisis Services department at the Main Campus.

You came into our lives when everyone else was turning us away and nothing compares to the care that he received here. Clarity is the only place we recommend to others who find themselves in similar circumstances."

Christ Lutheran is honoring Clarity by donating the entirety of our Wednesday Lenten Worship offerings to their critical work, which is only partially covered by Medicaid, and offered at no cost to the uninsured.

Greetings! This has been a busy few months for Mission and Outreach. Thank you all for your participation in serving our neighbors. I am writing this during the time of Lent as we await the passion of Jesus when he will suffer and die on the cross, and then Easter when he will be resurrected to be with God the Father. But before this occurs, he washes his disciples' feet on Maundy Thursday to serve as an example to them that they should do the same. His last words to his disciples are to love one another as he has loved them. This act of service is such a powerful depiction of what it means to love and serve our neighbors and serves as a reminder of God's unconditional love.

We assembled Care Kits for our Houseless Neighbors on Sunday, **March 15**, and we encourage church members to take one or two bags to give to someone who might need them. We hope you will share how this experience has affected you, as well as the recipients of the kits. **Please reach out to lisa@clcah.org to share your story.** This project is an outgrowth of our participation in the *Congregational Collective* that aims to bridge the gap between churches and those with mental health needs in our community through accompaniment, resources and referrals, and by creating a safe place. In 2016, she began work with asylum seekers in San Antonio with the *Interfaith Welcome Coalition* and other pro-immigrant organizations, and has seen the changes to policies and practices to immigration over the years. We will also hear from the prayer flag group at University Presbyterian who began creating these flags as a way to raise awareness and funds for *Interfaith Welcome Coalition*. Their prayer flags will be displayed in the crossway between, and after, services.

On Saturday, May 16, from 5:45 p.m.-8:30 p.m. we will be volunteering with *Communities Under the Bridge* "Downtown Dinners" homelessness ministry to serve a meal to unsheltered individuals. First Communion

Class – Sunday, April 12, 11:40 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.—Celebrated in Worship – Sunday, April 26, 10:30 a.m.

First Communion instruction will take place on Sunday, April 12, following the 10:30 a.m. worship service. Pastor Leslie leads our First Communion Class as we study the history of the sacrament, its rooting in scripture, and its theological importance in the life of faith. We also involve our students in preparing for First Communion Sunday by baking the Communion bread that we will use that Sunday, and by painting chalices (cups) and patens (plates) that will be used to serve Communion and remain with the students as keepsakes on their spiritual journey.

Class should conclude around 2:30 p.m., if not earlier, and lunch will be provided. One parent is asked to attend with their child to help reinforce their learning.
