From the Church Council

Dear Church Family,

On behalf of the Congregation Council, I want to update you on some of the issues discussed in our March 2, 2026 message to the congregation.

In that message, we noted that to improve financial oversight and security, the Council had decided to return to having distinct roles for our Office and Property Manager and Office Accountant. I am pleased to report that we have filled both positions.

While we initially considered utilizing an outside firm for accounting, we discovered that having a person in house was better for day-to-day operations. After working in the church office on an interim basis, Christ Lutheran Church member, Sharon Wiedemann, will be serving as Office Accountant, effective May 11. Sharon is a graduate of Trinity University and received an M.B.A. degree (summa cum laude) from the University of the Incarnate Word. From 1988 – 2026 Sharon held various positions at CPS Energy, most recently serving as manager of the Employee Benefits Pension and Life Plans (2007 - 2026), supervising a staff of four analysts (two CPA's and two Benefits Specialists).

Starting June 8, Teresa Hackett will be serving as Office and Property Manager. Teresa is a 2002 high honors graduate from the University of Texas with a degree in Applied Learning and Development. Since graduation, she has been an elementary school teacher, most recently at Northwood Elementary School in the North East I.S.D.

Please join me in congratulating Sharon and Teresa and in welcoming them to our church staff. Also, I want to thank our interim office staff - Vanessa Woodworth, Becky Richard, and Tracy Anderson. These three individuals stepped in and worked hard to make sure the church made it through this time of transition as gracefully as possible.

In addition to these staff appointments, the Council has voted to address one of our most urgent physical plant needs: replacing our current Education Wing HVAC unit. This aging unit is requiring frequent costly repairs and facing permanent failure in the not-so-distant future. The cost of the unit-- \$135,000 - \$145,000 – will be split between the church and Christ Lutheran Day School. The church's share will be funded from reserves.

Finally, the Council voted to replace our current sound system, which several members of our congregation have found inadequate and frustrating. The new system cost \$24,000 and was funded in part by generous donations from the Diana and Corder families with the balance funded from reserves. The system features all new equipment to improve sound quality and includes an application allowing members with hearing assistance devices to hear the service via Bluetooth.

The Council and the church property committee will continue to explore other facility needs. By focusing on our most urgent priorities, we are proceeding carefully, keeping in mind our responsibility to protect the long-term financial health of our church.

Synod Assembly Report

May 1 and 2, I attended the Synod Assembly at Triumphant Love Lutheran Church in Austin, Texas along with Pastor Leslie (who attended virtually). The theme was "Becoming...En Proceso." The scripture reading came from 1 John 3:2: "Beloved, we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed." It was a great time of learning and fellowship with churches around the Southwestern Texas Synod. We heard from the Churchwide DEM (Director of Evangelical Mission), Rev. Norma Malfatti. She talked about a mixed ecology of being church. This is reflected in the inherited church together with new expressions of the church. The inherited church forms a spiritual home base from which to explore new expressions, characterized by people gathering, listening, emphasizing relationship over attendance, and a worship community that is "with" not "for." She described these two forms of church as "roots and reach" that need each other.

After hearing from our guest speaker, we were able to go about the business of the church, including approving the Synod Council Budget and Mission Plan for 2026-2028. The voting members also approved two resolutions: "Stand and Act for Human Rights, Justice, and Peace for Palestine and Israel," and "The World Council of Churches Ecumenical Decade of Climate Justice and Action," and elected positions to serve the Consultation and Discipline Committees. I especially appreciated the variety of workshops that were offered throughout the assembly. There were about 15 different offerings. I attended one called "Becoming a Serving Church" (Food Justice Ministry) and "Becoming a Neighborhood Church" (Peace Housing Project). These workshops were inspiring. Peace Lutheran Church in Austin is building housing on their property for persons experiencing homelessness. Pastor Jamie Bouzard (ret.) recently developed a video curriculum around food justice which will be available for use on the Synod website. Let me know if you'd like to hear more about these programs. We also heard from the Synod's partners in ministry and participated in a wonderful worship service. There is a lot of great work going on in our Synod, and I encourage you to take the time to check out the materials on the Synod website. Maybe you'd be interested in attending the next Synod assembly as a voting member. I'll close with a Martin Luther quote: "This life therefore is not godliness, but growth in godliness... we are not yet what we shall be, but we are on the way."

Michael Fischer Honors His Late Wife with \$25K Gift to CLC

Kim Fischer, the late wife of CLC's Congregation Council President, Dr. Michael Fischer, was an educator, development director, wife, mother, and beloved member of the Trinity University, Christ Lutheran and greater San Antonio communities. Her untimely death from a massive stroke on April 15, 2022, was a shock to all who knew and loved her. She was beautiful, intelligent, active, and a fitness devotee who enjoyed working out, swimming, walking, and playing golf.

The Fischers' grown children, Sarah and Joshua, are her proud legacy, and they were delighted when Michael honored his beloved Kim with a unique and meaningful memorial. He recently presented Christ Lutheran with a \$25,000 gift in recognition of two of Kim's greatest passions – education and our congregation.

Michael tells us, "Kim was a lifelong educator who loved teaching and learning. This gift will be used to support Faith University and continuing education – allowing our pastors to bring in professors, experts, and other speakers of interest to enrich and expand Christ Lutheran's deep commitment to education."

Kim and Michael joined Christ Lutheran shortly after moving to San Antonio in 2000, when Michael began his tenure as a professor and administrator at Trinity University. He retired this May after his most recent academic honor as the Janet S. Dicke Professor in Public Humanities. He has had a proud career in academia, and Kim was always at his side. At the time of her death, she was serving as Chief Academic Development Officer at the University of Texas at San Antonio.

Kim was a faithful member of CLC where she served on the Congregation Council, and Michael is completing his second term as Council President this summer.

We are honored by this gift, and grateful to Michael for this thoughtful way of keeping Kim's memory alive. Pastor Leslie Price noted, "This generous gift is a beautiful reflection of Kim's spirit. It ensures that her lifelong devotion to learning and her deep love for this church will nourish our minds and inspire our faith for years to come. We are incredibly grateful to the Fischers for the many ways they continue to contribute to our congregational life."

We will celebrate and acknowledge this endowment gift in worship on Sunday, June 21.

Your Lenten Gifts: \$4,595 to Clarity Child Guidance Center

St. Luke's Lutheran Health Ministries Awards \$207,000 in Spring Grants to Area Healthcare Non-Profits

St. Luke's Lutheran Health Ministries (SLLHM), a ministry of the Southwestern Texas Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, has awarded \$207,000 in grants to 28 non-profit healthcare organizations in Bexar and surrounding counties in its semi-annual grant cycle. The grants range from \$2,000 to \$25,000, benefitting organizations providing medical/mental/dental care, equipment and supplies related to care, and education/prevention/wellness initiatives.

Christ Lutheran members Adam Braaten, Jan Norris, Laura O'Donnell, Pastor David Schulte, and Pastor Howard Stendahl serve on the SLLHM Board of Directors.

Xavier Rodriguez, Judge of the United States District Court for the Western District of Texas, is Chair of the SLLHM Board of Directors. He noted, "SLLHM is proud to continue the legacy of providing comfort, hope, and healing, as established by the former St. Luke's Lutheran Hospital."

Since its founding in 1994, SLLHM has awarded \$12,895,167 to its charitable partners. SLLHM continues the tradition of St. Luke's Lutheran Hospital, which was founded in 1976, then sold to the Baptist Health System in 1994. SLLHM was founded using the proceeds of the sale to continue the hospital's legacy of caring for the health of the community.

One high-impact grant of \$25,000 was awarded to Project MEND, the only non-profit in Texas that collects, refurbishes, sanitizes, and distributes medical equipment to individuals who cannot afford the items they need or are faced with gaps in their insurance coverage. For over 30 years, Project MEND has been transforming lives through their grass roots non-profit work.

Mission and Outreach Team Report

Greetings! Summer is upon us! I hope everyone stays cool indoors when they can and hope you also can enjoy summer outdoor activities (preferably that involve water). Just recapping this past month and letting you know about some opportunities to serve our neighbors in the summer months.

Lauren Byrd from NAMI (National Alliance for Mental Illness) shared about this important resource in our community during Faith University on Sunday, May 3. If you want more information about support groups and classes for mental illness, you can visit their website at nami-sat.org or call 210-734-3349, There is also a "warm line" (210-939-9999) for anyone who might have questions or just need to talk. Mental illness affects 1 in 5 adults annually.

On May 16, a group from Christ Lutheran volunteered at "Taking it to the Streets," a ministry of Communities Under the Bridge which serves a meal every Saturday night to those experiencing homelessness. We made sandwiches, distributed meals, gave out clothing, and helped clean up. It was great volunteering with other groups and reaching out to our most vulnerable neighbors. We hope to do this again soon. Thanks to Jeff Hammack, Jacob Kirkpatrick, Natalie Torrez, Joshua Halverson, Isabel Vaughan, and Julie Seamans for volunteering.

We also heard from Christopher Edmiston of Haven for Hope during Faith University. Haven for Hope is one of our benevolence partners. We learned that 70% of the 10,000 people experiencing homelessness in San Antonio every year seek shelter at Haven for Hope. Chris also shared that some 1,400 individuals call Haven home each day. Haven for Hope partners with over 75 organizations, 45 of those on their campus. Every \$1 spent at Haven has a \$42 impact. They have many different programs, including Young at Heart for Seniors, a mobile Outreach Team, and a Jail Diversion program. Become involved by volunteering, individually or as a group, giving financially or in-kind through gifts such as men's jeans and belts, or take an in-person tour.

We are planning to schedule a group tour of their facility in June. Please contact Deacon Lisa Diana at lisa@clcah.org if you would like to be a part of this tour.
